

Information about COVID-19 Vaccines

Now that COVID-19 vaccines have been authorized for use in the United States, here is some important information about the vaccines, their safety, and when you will be eligible to receive a vaccination.

COVID-19 vaccination is free, regardless of your insurance or immigration status.

It is possible to get COVID-19 again. So, even if you have already had COVID-19 or have COVID-19 antibodies you should still get the vaccine.

Clinical studies included people from all ethnic and racial groups, as well as individuals who have significant health issues. These studies have shown that the vaccines are safe. You cannot get COVID-19 from these vaccines. The studies show that the vaccines currently authorized for use are 94-95% effective against COVID-19.
